
London in the early 19th century became the center of the Spanish-American independence movement. After the publication of the famous Letter to the Spanish Americans by Peruvian Juan Pablo Viscardo, a group of South American exiles and intellectuals in favour of independence was formed in London, led by Francisco de Miranda. Ecuadorian born J.M. Antepara was deeply enlightenment influenced by ideals of republicanism, and human rights. In 1803 he was in London and soon joined the American Lodge of Rational Knights, whose Grand Master and founder was Miranda, together they collaborated on several publications advocating for independence from Spanish rule in South America.


Published in London in 1810, J.M. Antepara "South American Emancipation" is one of the first published works explicitly calling for South American independence, appearing even before some of the first formal independence movements in Argentina (1810) and Venezuela (1811). The book is an historical significant document in the intellectual history of Latin American independence. Rarity: surviving copies are mostly found in specialised archives and research libraries. Very rare on the market, apart from this copy, I could not trace any other example since one was sold in 2008.

In 1794, the first translation of Don Quixote appeared in Lisbon, entitled O Engenhoso Fidalgo Dom Quixote de la Mancha. The title page contains information indicating that the book was "translated in the vernacular", but the name of the translator is not given. The printer, Typografia Rollandiana, was established by Francisco Rolland after he moved to Lisbon (from France) in the second half of the XVIII century, becoming one of the most successful publishers of his time. Interestingly, the release of the translation was announced in La Gazette de Lisboa on December 27, 1794: "The Ingenious Nobleman Don Quixote de la Mancha, by Miguel de Cervantes Saavedra, is published, translated into Portuguese, in 6 vols. [...] This work, translated into all the languages of the educated nations of Europe, now appears in ours, for the enjoyment and instruction of the Portuguese". Rare and interesting edition for Cervantes collectors.



Manuel A Fuentes, aka "the bat", was a Peruvian writer, a fan of political satire and the historical genre, a journalist, a jurist and a professor of legal medicine. Fuentes' Lima: apuntes históricos, descriptivos, estadísticos y de costumbres, also published in both French and English (as Lima. Sketches of the Capital of Peru...), is lavishly illustrated with lithographs and engravings. Working in the late 1850s and the 1860s, Fuentes took advantage of new and developing technologies such as photography and lithography. He also pursued connections with Parisian artisans and worked with local printers to create dynamic and interesting publications. In 2022, the Peruvian Ministry of Culture declared this book part of the Cultural Heritage of the Nation and remain a valuable resource for understanding Lima's mid-19th-century society, offering insights into its social life, traditions, and urban landscape. Offered here is the much rarer Spanish language edition, in its original binding, published a year after the French and English editions.



Little is known about the author of this book, the Spanish historian Julian del Castillo. According to his works, he was a resident of the town of Arroyo de Muñó in the Archbishopric of Burgos. He published the first edition of this book in Burgos in 1582. The second edition(1624) is offered here, which, according to Palau, is preferred by scholars because it is more accurate and contains additions by Fr. Geronimo de Castro y Castillo.



The editor Joseph Skinner compiled The Present State of Peru based on articles written for Mercurio Peruano, a Lima newspaper, the 20 beautiful plates were created, according to Skinner, by an "untutored native". The book catered to a British audience fascinated by the geography, flora, fauna, and indigenous populations of distant lands. Abbey Travel 723.



Original edition of this dictionary, one of the first in the vernacular in Europe.Covarrubias Spanish dictionary, first published in 1611 with 1000 copies printed, was considered to be the most important lexicographical works of its time, and remained the most authoritative until the publication of Diccionario de la Lengua Española by the Real Academia Española in 1770

Covarrubias, a scholar and cleric, sought to not only define words but also provide insights into their origins, meanings, and uses in literature, thus enriching the understanding of the Spanish language during the Golden Age. El Tesoro de la Lengua is both a linguistic and cultural treasure of early seventeen century Spain.

In may 1857, the Chilean rear admiral Robert Simpson wrote to Lord Cochrane: "I have been requested to procure a biographical sketch of your Lordship's eventful life in order to its publication in this country". That same year Cochrane began work on the first of his autobiographies. The English edition was published in 1859 in two volumes, (Narrative of Services...). Offered here is the much rarer Spanish edition published in London the same year in one volume. Clearly aimed at a Chilean audience, Thomas Cochrane says in the prologue: "This is the story of my relationship with Chilean independence, the details of which are set out in this volume". A beautiful and rare book that would appeal to the collector interested in Chile.



Horacio Descole compiled and directed the corpus Genera et Species Animalium Argentinorum, a scientific work that addresses the nomenclature, description and classification of all animal species in Argentina. These works were published by the Miguel Lillo Foundation and the National University of Tucumán between 1943 and 1956. The books were printed by Editorial Kraft in Buenos Aires, and the illustrations, whenever possible, are life-size. This relationship contributed to their closer resemblance to living flora than those commonly used in scientific works, "thus allowing those who are not professional botanists to determine with relative ease the genus and species of the plants that interest them," praised the compiler, Descole. UNESCO considered Genera et Species... one of the most important scientific contributions of the 20th century, which aspired to be a complete record of Argentine flora and fauna.

Rarity: very rare in the market, I could not trace any sale of the complete 4 volume set.

Condition: vols 1 and 2 slightly discoloured, hinges starting vol 1 & 4 w/tape, occasional browning. Very heavy, will require additional postage. A nice set of a beautiful book.






Esteemed edition of "Don Quixote," illustrated and translated by a father and daughter team, engraved from paintings of Robert Smirke and translated by her daughter Mary Smirke. Smirke became a full member of the Royal Academy with his paintings on Don Quixote and Sancho in 1793. Some of his work is currently in the Guildhall Art Gallery. This is an attractive copy, of interest to all Cervantes collectors.


It is very rare to find a complete example of this first Spanish-language edition of a seminal work in Latin American historiography. The Historia del Reino de Quito was written during Velasco's exile in Italy, following the expulsion of the Jesuits from Spanish territories in 1767 and published posthumously, by the government of Ecuador, between 1841 and 1844. Velasco's book was the first comprehensive attempt to write a history of what would become Ecuador. It covered geography, ethnography, and political history, making it an essential source for understanding colonial perceptions of indigenous societies. Juan de Velasco's works reflect how history was written and used in the construction of national identity. The History of the Kingdom of Quito is an important and historically significant book.



The comprehensive list includes the name of the owner, the name of the property, and the fiscal appraisal of all properties in Cundinamarca. It is, without a doubt, an important source of data for historical research on Colombia in the second half of the eighteenth century.
